

RESOLUTION NO.: R-2000-013

*Authorizing Summer Concert Series  
and Labor Day Concert in Finlay Park*

WHEREAS, the Columbia Action Council is sponsoring its Summer Concert Series at Finlay Park from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. to run on Saturday evenings of June 3, 2000 through August 26, 2000 and a Labor Day Concert to run from 6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 2, 2000,

WHEREAS, the Council has requested permission to allow the possession and consumption of beer and wine beverages by its patrons at the concerts; and,

WHEREAS, it has been determined that such an event would be in the public interest; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council this 5th day of April, 2000, that between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on Saturday evenings of June 3, 2000 through August 26, 2000, patrons of the Summer Concert Series and a Labor Day Concert between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 2, 2000 are permitted to possess and consume beer and wine beverages in the amphitheater area of Finlay Park.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all pets shall be prohibited. Coolers, glass bottles and breakable glasses and/or cups, grills and radios, boom boxes and other musical devices shall be prohibited; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that during the designated time the amphitheater area of Finlay Park shall be declared to be a Public Park and provisions of Chapter 15, Parks and Recreation, Sec. 15-1, 15-2 and 15-3, Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina are in effect. Pursuant to Chapter 14, Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions, Article IV, Offenses Against the Public Peace and Order, Sec. 14-99, 1998 Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina, the amphitheater area of Finlay Park is deemed to be the site of a public festival at which alcoholic beverages may be consumed and the prohibition against possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages as set forth in Sec. 14-99 shall not apply.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that no solicitation or transactions be made in violation of Sec. 14-32, 1998 Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina.
