

RESOLUTION NO.: R-2000-056

*Authorizing possession and consumption of beer  
and wine in Hollywood Park*

WHEREAS, the Hollywood-Rose Hill Neighborhood Association is sponsoring a neighborhood picnic on Saturday, October 21, 2000 from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. and a concert and picnic on Sunday, October 22, 2000 from 4:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at Hollywood Park; and,

WHEREAS, the Association has requested permission for guests to possess and consume beer and wine beverages at the events; and,

WHEREAS, it has been determined that such events would be in the public interest;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council this 4th day of October, 2000, that between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Saturday, October 21, 2000 and between the hours of 4:30 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 22, 2000, guests at the neighborhood picnic and concert and picnic are allowed to possess and consume beer and wine beverages within the Hollywood Park area; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that only pedestrian traffic will be allowed within the area. All other traffic, including, but not limited to, automobiles, trucks, motorcycles, mopeds, bicycles, skate boards, and horses, except police horses, is prohibited. All pets, including reptiles, shall be prohibited. Bottles, breakable glasses and/or cups shall be prohibited; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that during the designated time the Hollywood Park area, with the exception of the parking area and any other areas posted as to not allow alcoholic beverages, shall be declared to be a Public Park and provisions of Chapter 15, Parks and

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Recreation, Sec. 15-1, 15-2 and 15-3, Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina are in effect. Pursuant to Chapter 14, Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions, Article IV, Offenses Against the Public Peace and Order, Sec. 14-99, 1998 Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina, the Hollywood Park area, with the exception of the parking area and any other areas posted as to not allow alcoholic beverages, is deemed to be the site of a public festival at which alcoholic beverages may be consumed and the prohibition against possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages set forth in Sec. 14-99 shall not apply.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that no solicitation or transactions be made in violation of Sec. 14-32, 1998 Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina.

On October 21, a group of families will be hosting a party for some other families from Columbia and their children. We will be providing BBQ from Shealy's and will ask the guest to bring their own beverages.

On October 22 we will be having our neighbor, Dick Goodwin, and his band perform live in the park for all in the neighborhood. We plan on each family bringing a blanket and a picnic dinner and enjoying the soft sounds of the band. Mr. Goodwin performed for our neighborhood last fall and it was a big hit!

We do not plan to sell any beer or wine, we are only requesting permission to allow our guests, if they so desire, to be allowed to bring beer and wine to accompany dinner. It is our understanding that if we are not selling beer or wine that we do not need a temporary license from the Alcohol License Division of the Department of Revenue. Please inform me if this is not correct.

Also, we have already notified the Parks and Recreation Department of this function. I would be grateful if you would let me know whether there is anyone else in the city to whom I should provide notice.
