

**RESOLUTION NO.: R-2002-062**

*Authorizing consumption of alcoholic beverages and Eau Claire Renaissance Faire at Earlewood Park on Friday, October 18, 2002 and at Hyatt Park on Saturday, October 19, 2002*

WHEREAS, the Eau Claire Community Council ("Council") is sponsoring its Renaissance Faire on Friday, October 18, 2002 from 5:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. at Earlewood Park , and Saturday, October 19, 2002 from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at Hyatt Park; and,

WHEREAS, the Council has requested permission for the temporary closing and use of Main Street from Marshall Street/Sunset Drive to Monticello Road from 9:30 a.m. until 11:00 a.m.; and, Monticello Road from Main Street to Jackson Street; Monticello Road to Lamar Street and Lamar Street from Jackson Street to Kortwright Street from 9:30 a.m. until 5:00 p.m., for preparation and staging of the area for an outdoor event to be held between 5:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on Friday, October 18, 2002 at Earlewood Park and between 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, October 19, 2002. Patrons shall be allowed to consume alcoholic beverages at the event during the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. on Friday, October 18, 2002 at Earlewood Park and between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, October 19, 2002 at Hyatt Park; and,

WHEREAS, it has been determined that such an event would be in the public interest; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council this 18th day of September, 2002, that the sale of alcoholic beverages is authorized between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. at Earlewood Park on Friday, October 18, 2002 and between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. at Hyatt Park on Saturday, October 19, 2002; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all vendors be restricted to stationary location; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that only pedestrian traffic will be allowed within the area.

All other traffic, including, but not limited to, automobiles, trucks, motorcycles, mopeds, bicycles, skate boards, and horses, except police horses, is prohibited. All pets, including snakes, shall be prohibited. Coolers, glass bottles, breakable glasses and/or cups, large bags and backpacks shall be prohibited; and,


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that during the designated time the closed portion of Main Street from Marshall Street/Sunset Drive to Monticello Road; and, Monticello Road from Main Street to Jackson Street; Monticello Road to Lamar Street and Lamar Street from Jackson Street to Kortwright Street, with the exception of the parking area and any other areas posted as to not allow alcoholic beverages, shall be declared to be a Public Park and provisions of Chapter 15, Parks and Recreation, Sec. 15-1, 15-2 and 15-3, 1998 Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina are in effect. Pursuant to Chapter 14, Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions, Article IV, Offenses Against the Public Peace and Order, Sec. 14-99, 1998 Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina, Main Street from Marshall Street/Sunset Drive to Monticello Road; and, Monticello Road from Main Street to Jackson Street; Monticello Road to Lamar Street and Lamar Street from Jackson Street to Kortwright Street, with the exception of the parking area and any other areas posted as to not allow alcoholic beverages, is deemed to be the site of a public festival at which alcoholic beverages may be consumed and the prohibition against possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages set forth in Sec. 14-99 shall not apply. Possession and consumption of alcoholic

beverages shall be permitted only in containers provided by vendors within the area designated.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that no solicitation or transactions be made in violation of Code


