

RESOLUTION NO.: R-2005-073

Authorizing the Five Points Association to Conduct Street and Sidewalk Sales for the "St. Pat's in Five Points Festival"

WHEREAS, the Five Points Association is sponsoring the "St. Pat's in Five Points Festival" to raise funds for charity, beautification and revitalization of the Five Points area on Saturday, March 18th, 2006, with rain contingencies to include Saturday night and Sunday, March 19th, 2006; and,

WHEREAS, the Association has requested permission to conduct sidewalk sales as part of the celebration; and,

WHEREAS, it has been determined that such an event would be in the best public interest; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council this 18th day of January, 2006, that between the hours of 9:00 a. m. and 8:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 18, 2006 (and in the event of rain, from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. Saturday, March 18, 2006), merchants in Five Points are authorized to operate sale booths for items normally sold in their course of business on the sidewalks immediately in front of their places of business with the Five Points area bounded by Gervais, Blossom, Heidt, and Lauren Streets; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that street sales of arts and crafts items (to be defined as items which are in whole or in part handmade and not items purchased for resale) and food and beverage items and game booths be permitted and that the Association be authorized to determine and allocate available space to vendors and to charge reasonable fees to cover its

costs in promoting and operating the festival. The Association may limit the number of vendors based on the space available. The Five Points Association sponsored beer sales are authorized between 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. and The Five Points Association sponsored food sales will stop at 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 18, 2006. In the event of rain on Saturday, March 18, 2006, beer and food sales shall be extended through 9:00 p.m. The Association shall prescribe the required application form and appropriate deadline for receiving application; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all vendors be restricted to stationary location and the Association shall approve or disapprove all amplified entertainment activities; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that only pedestrian traffic will be allowed within the area designated on the attached map. All other traffic, including, but not limited to, automobiles, trucks, motorcycles, mopeds, bicycles, skateboards, and horses, except police horses, are prohibited. Pets shall be prohibited. Coolers, glass bottles, breakable glasses and/or breakable cups, and backpacks shall be prohibited in the festival area as designated on the attached map; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that during the designated time the area shown on the attached map is designated to be a Public Park and provisions of Chapter 15, Parks and Recreation, Sec. 15-1, 15-2 and 15-3, 1998 Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina are in effect. Pursuant to Chapter 14, Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions, Article IV, Offenses Against the Public Peace and Order, Sec. 14-99, 1998 Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina, the area designated on the attached

map is deemed to be the site of a public festival at which alcoholic beverages may be consumed and the prohibition against possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages as set forth in Sec. 14-99 shall not apply, however, possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted only in containers provided by the Five Points Association within the area designated.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that should it rain on Saturday, March 18, 2006, the Festival's hours of operation will be extended until 10:00 p.m. Furthermore, depending on the amount of rain during the event Saturday March 18, 2006, and in the sole judgment of the Five Points Association, its Board of Directors and the St. Pat's in Five Points Committee, the event will also be extended to include Sunday, March 19, 2006, between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m.; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in the event of rain the event is extended to include Sunday, March 19, 2006, beer and food sales shall be authorized between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, March 19, 2006; and,

PROVIDED, FURTHER, the street and sidewalk sale shall be allowed during either of these dates and hours of operation as listed above.

PROVIDED, FURTHER, that in the event that it does not rain, the streets as depicted on the attached map shall be closed to through traffic, and parking by non-residents shall be prohibited, between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. on Saturday, March 18, 2006. In the event of rain, the streets shall be closed through 12:00 a.m. Sunday, March 19, 2006.

PROVIDED, FURTHER, in the event that it does rain on Saturday, March 18, 2006,

the streets as depicted on the attached map shall be closed to through traffic, and parking by non-residents shall be prohibited, Sunday, March 19, 2006, between the hours of 12:00:01 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.

PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that sidewalks shall not be obstructed for pedestrian traffic in violation of Sec. 22-72, 1998 Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina, and that no solicitation or transactions be made in violation of Sec. 14-32, 1998 Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, South Carolina, and that no vendor locations be allowed on any street not closed by the Mayor and Council during the period of celebration.

shaking hands with the President and First lady and when eating or drinking. Women wear a dressier outfit for late afternoon receptions but cocktail or evening dresses are not appropriated. Men wear business suits and ties to these events.

DRESS FOR DINNERS AT THE WHITE HOUSE

Dinners at the White House are almost always formal. However, during the Carter Administration, informal dinners were held where men wore dark business suits and ties and women wore dressy, late afternoon dresses or suits with short skirts. During the Johnson
